### **GRADUATE THESIS**

Title: One Hundred Years of Bohemian Eroticism: Walt Whitman, Mina Loy and Allen Ginsberg

The thesis investigates the reoccurring and constantly evolving theme of eroticism in Bohemian poetry, beginning with Walt Whitman's Leaves of Grass(1855), continuing with Mina Loy's "Love Songs" and other poems(1916), and ending with Allen Ginsberg's infamous "Howl" (1955). The paper considers the social, political and cultural conditions during their respective time periods and examines the critical reception each received from their contemporaries. By offering a close reading of specific poems, the inquiry asks, why was erotic expression a necessary subject for these poets? What agenda did they hope to progress in writing about sexuality? What impact did their expressed sexual liberation have on American society?
